Regularly Scheduled Session of Mayor & Council Monday, December 30, 2013, 7 p.m. Phillip L. Pittore Justice Center, 25 South Union Street, Lambertville Minutes

The meeting was called to order by Mayor DelVecchio at 7 PM with a statement of compliance with the open public meeting act, with the clerk providing the required notice on Thursday, December 26, 2013 to the Beacon, the Democrat, the Times, posting the agenda to the bulletin board at city hall, the website at www.lambertvillenj.org, and noticing various people on the list serve, inclusive of department heads, city attorney and city engineer.

WHEREAS, the City of Lambertville hereafter referred to as "**Public Entity**" is a member of the Public Alliance Insurance Coverage Fund, hereinafter referred to as "**Fund**"; and

WHEREAS, said renewal membership terminates as of January 1, 2014 at 12:01 a.m. standard time, unless earlier renewed by agreement between the **Public Entity** and the **Fund**; and

WHEREAS, the Public Entity is afforded the following types of coverages:

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:5-17.1 a resolution may be adopted by the governing body of a municipality authorizing a municipal employee to process without further action on the part of the governing body the cancellation of any property tax credit or delinquency of less than \$10.00;
