STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE.

ORDINANCES - INTRODUCTION AND FIRST READING.

Ordinance Number 01-2015: An Ordinance to Amend a Bond Ordinance Number 01-2013 Adding \$55,000 to Fund the Generator Project at the Free and Public Library and the Phillip L. Pittore Justice Center. This Ordinance is offset by A Grant from FEMA, Funding \$153,663.26 of the Project.

Mayor DelVecchio read the ordinance into the record by title. He informed the members of the public present that this will fund the upgrades to the Phillip L. Pittore Justice Center and the Lambertville Free and Public Library for the installation and completion of the automated generator. Both facilities will be used as a cooling or warming station for the members of the public with the Lambertville Free Public Library acting as the main site. City Hall will function as the primary site for the Office of Emergency Management. Mayor DelVecchio explained that the generator at City Hall is fully functional. Should the city suffer from a power outage, City Hall could function as the Office of Emergency Management while also acting as a

warming/cooling station. It is not the best practice for functioning and would limit the people we serve.

City of Lambertville ORDINANCE NUMBER 01-2015

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING A SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION OF \$55,000 FOR ACQUISITION OF EMERGENCY GENERATORS IN AND BY THE CITY OF LAMBERTVILLE, IN THE COUNTY OF HUNTERDON, NEW JERSEY AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$55,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE CITY FOR FINANCING PART OF THE APPROPRIATION.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL, OF THE CITY OF LAMBERTVILLE, IN THE COUNTY OF HUNTERDON, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvement described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance has heretofore been authorized to be undertaken by the City of Lambertville, New Jersey as a general improvement. For the improvement or purpose described in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the supplemental amount of \$55,000. Such sum being in addition to the \$150,000 appropriated therefore by bond ordinance 23-2014 of the City finally adopted September 16, 2014, the \$63,000 appropriated therefor by bond ordinance #10-2012 of the City finally adopted May 21, 2012, as amended by Bond Ordinance 20-2012, finally adopted December 17, 2012 and as supplemented by Bond Ordinance 01-2013, finally adopted March 19, 2013 (collectively, the "Prior Ordinances") and including the sum of \$153,663.26 in grants from the New Jersey Department of Law and Public Safety's Mitigation Unit Emergency Management Section Grant Program as set forth in prior award letters, as supplemented by an award letter dated January 7, 2015 in the amount of \$106,259.26 (the "State Grant"). In accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-11(c), no down payment is required to be made due to the State Grant.

<u>Section 2</u>. In order to finance the additional cost of the improvement or purpose not covered by application of the additional down payment, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$55,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of the bonds, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

- Section 3. (a) The improvements hereby authorized and the purposes for which the bonds or notes are to be issued include the acquisition and permanent installation of emergency electrical generators, including related electrical and gas utility work, at the Lambertville Free Public Library and the City's Phillip L. Pittore Justice Center each as set forth in a list on file in the office of the City Clerk, and including all work and related materials necessary therefor or incidental thereto.
- (b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for the improvement or purpose is \$407,350, including the \$352,350bonds or notes authorized by the Prior Ordinances and the \$55,000 bonds or notes authorized herein.
- (c) The estimated cost of the improvement or purpose is \$408,000, including the \$363,000 appropriated by the Prior Ordinances and the \$55,000 appropriated herein.

Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer. The chief financial officer shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8(a). The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time, at not less than par and accrued interest, at public or private sale and to deliver them to the

purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The capital budget or temporary capital budget (as applicable) of the City is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. In the event of any such inconsistency and amendment, the resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget or amended temporary capital budget (as applicable) and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

Section 6. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

- (a) The several improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses. They are improvements or purposes the City may lawfully undertake as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.
- (b) The average period of usefulness of the improvements or purposes, within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, computed on the basis of respective amounts or obligations for the several purposes and the respective reasonable life thereof within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, is 15.00 years.
- (c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the City as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$59,850, and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by that Law.
- (d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$53,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20, consisting of \$40,000 appropriated for such purposes in the Prior Ordinances and the \$13,000 appropriated herein, are included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the improvements or purposes.
- (e) The City reasonably expects to commence the acquisition of the several improvements or purposes described in Section 3 hereof, and to advance all or a portion of the costs in respect thereof, prior to the issuance of bonds or notes hereunder. To the extent such costs are advanced, the City further reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance, in an aggregate amount not to exceed the amount of bonds or notes authorized in Section 1 hereof.
- Section 7. Any grant moneys received for the purposes described in Section 3 hereof shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.
- Section 8. The full faith and credit of the City is hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the City, and the City shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the City for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.
- Section 9. The City Council hereby covenants on behalf of the City to take any action necessary or refrain from taking such action in order to preserve the tax-exempt status of the bonds and notes authorized hereunder as is or may be required under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and the regulations promulgated thereunder (the "Code"), including compliance with the Code with regard to the use, expenditure, investment, timely reporting and rebate of investment earnings as may be required thereunder.
- _____ Section 10. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

Mayor DelVecchio asked for a motion to introduce on first reading, Ordinance Number 01-2015. Councilman Sanders made a motion to introduce Ordinance Number 01-2015 which will fund the upgrades to the Library and Justice Center for automated generators. Councilwoman Warner seconded the motion. An affirmative roll call vote was taken in favor of the motion by all members present. MOTION CARRIED.

Mayor DelVecchio informed the members of the public present that the public hearing is scheduled for February 17, 2015.

ORDINANCES - SECOND READING AND FINAL ADOPTION - NONE. CORRESPONDENCE.

BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS, COUNTY OF HUNTERDON: A Resolution Adopted Regarding the Transportation Trust Fund.

JCP&L: Public Hearing for Basic Generation Service Charges (BGS) procured by JCP&L on behalf of BGS customers and recovery through its BGS charges of New Jersey Board of Public Utilities approved changes in capacity performance costs.

STATE OF NEW JERSEY DEP regarding applicant: Hunterdon Medical Center. The Division of Land Use Regulation has determined that freshwater wetlands and waters are not present on the referenced property.

STATE OF NEW JERSEY, OAG: Award to the City of Lambertville – Two (2) Generators, Under HMGP-DR-4086-NJ-0159 in the amount of \$153,663.26.

FRANK L. KRAMER, JR.: Letter of resignation from the Lambertville Municipal Utilities Authority.

OLD BUSINESS.

Update on Various Construction Improvement Projects.

2015 Road Projects: Mayor DelVecchio informed the members of the public present that the City received a grant from NJDOT to reconstruct Upper York Street and Washington Street (from York to Route 179). We are waiting for the city engineer to submit her proposal to schedule a public meeting with the residents.

Library Roof: Mayor DelVecchio informed the members of the public present that the city architect is in the process of preparing a bid for the reconstruction of the Library roof. This will include the porch roofs and it is anticipated that this project will be complete by early spring.

Generator Projects: Mayor DelVecchio informed the members of the public present that the city engineer is in the process of filing the applications with SHPO for the generator projects at the Library and the Phillip L. Pittore Justice Center. The project will be bid in February with an award at the March 17th session of Mayor and Council. We anticipate both projects to be complete by August of this year.

Update on projects for Flood Relief.

Swan Creek Flood Gates: Mayor DelVecchio informed the members of the public present that the City has a tentative meeting scheduled with FEMA representatives for February 4th at Senator Booker's office.

Update on Various Non-Construction Projects.

South Hunterdon Regional School District.

Shared Services: Mayor DelVecchio informed the members of the public present that the City has signed the contract with Frenchtown for construction services and is in the process of signing the contract with West Amwell for Animal Control Services.

Garbage & Recycling.

Mayor DelVecchio inquired about the expiration date for the shared services agreement with West Amwell Township for the Recycling Truck. The Clerk stated that the contract expires in September of 2015. Mayor DelVecchio asked the clerk to put it on the calendar for July.

Recycling: Mayor DelVecchio informed the members of the public present that the city exceeded 1,000 tons in recycling for 2014.

Council President Stegman asked the Clerk to research the purchase of garbage/recycling cans off state contract for the residents. Mayor DelVecchio commented that we would need to consult with the DCA to make sure the City could do that and he asked the clerk to contact the office of procurement.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

STATE OF THE CITY ADDRESS AND 2015 BUDGET: Mayor DelVecchio informed the members of the public present that the city will introduce the budget in February and then he will give the State of the City Address.

DOG AND CAT LICENSES are available for purchase starting Friday, January 2, 2015 at City Hall, 18 York Street. The fee for a spayed dog or cat is \$15. Licensing of dogs a requirement of the NJSA 4. A \$25 late fee imposed beginning March 1, 2015.

PARKING PERMITS for those residing on metered streets will be available for purchase starting the week of December 23rd at City Hall. The annual fee is \$45 for a Permanent Residential Parking Permit, \$60 for a Transferrable Permit, and \$25 for a Temporary Parking Permit.
