Brief Notes:

- Suez is currently neutral on the current proposal, but does not have sufficient information to finalize its position on the proposed route.
- Suez contact with Pipeline Company has been limited to a request to do a site visit and the follow up visit by PennEast.
- PennEast indicated that it would do follow-up analysis on the impact of the project on Suez operations, but gave no timeframe for its presentation of such information to Suez.
- Suez representatives were unaware of information found in Docket No. CP15-558-000 indicating that United Water of Lambertville was "willing to sell water to PennEast for the project. Quantity of water available is being confirmed."
- Per Mr. Sidorn -- Lambertville dam is designated by the State as a "high hazard dam", defined in New Jersey law as one in which "the failure of which may cause probable loss of life or extensive property damage. (N.J.A.C. 7:20-1.8).
- Suez concerned generally about the integrity of the dam, its plant, and the intake and will review the project based on the risk it presents.

Action Items:

- Suez promised to:
 - Sign on as intervenor
 - Submit comments by the 9/12 deadline to the DEIS and provide a copy to the City of Lambertville.
 - Consider information we may provide on the impact of Pipeline on our drinking water supply.
 - Research and provide information to the Mayor on a Green Acres grant from the early 2000's regarding land near the reservoir.
 - o Identify a date for a site visit by members of the CAP committee and the Mayor.
- Mike to provide to Suez:
 - o Information about Pipeline's specific statements regarding intention to do blasting, and how that impacts the Pipeline project near the Suez operations.
 - o Information about arsenic
- Mike to provide to Ward:
 - Sample resolutions from other municipalities, boards, commissions, etc. (including those from West Amwell) for consideration as models for Lambertville to consider.
- Cindy to notice CAP Committee meeting for Friday, 9/2 8:00 am 8:45 am
 - o Agenda: Work on development of draft DEIS comments from the City of Lambertville, to be shared with community members as a guide.
- Ward:
