




Pipeline Overdevelopment

- New Jersey already has five major interstate pipelines -1,500 miles of pipelines
- Research shows NJ does NOT need new pipelines
- NJ had an extra 1.7 bcf/d gas capacity on this past winter's coldest days.

PennEast Timeline

- PennEast begins "open season" August, 2014
- PennEast first applies to FERC and enters pre-filing period October, 2014
- PennEast formally applies to FERC September, 2015
- PennEast first applies to NJDEP April, 2017
- NJ DEP deems application 'administratively incomplete' April, 2017
- NJ DEP deems application 'administratively closed' June, 2017
- FERC issues Certificate January, 2018
- NJ DEP denies 2017 application February, 2018
- State refuses land deal February, 2018
- FERC files Notice of Condemnation in N.J. District court on February, 2018
- District Court Grants Eminent Domain December, 2018
- PennEast re-applies to NJ DEP August, 2019
- NJ DEP deems application 'administratively incomplete' September, 2019

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The Decision...

PennEast v. State of NJ

On September 10, 2019, in *In re: PennEast Pipeline Company, LLC*, the United States Court of Appeals for the Third Circuit ruled in favor of New Jersey finding that its sovereign immunity under the 11th Amendment prohibited PennEast Pipeline from condemning property owned by the State of New Jersey.



11th Amendment

The Judicial power of the United States shall not be construed to extend to any suit in law or equity, commenced or prosecuted against one of the United States by Citizens of another State, or by Citizens or Subjects of any Foreign State.

Section 7 – Natural Gas Act

Holder of a certificate of public convenience and necessity may acquire property by exercising right of eminent domain.

- No waver of sovereign immunity under the Natural Gas Act
- The Third Circuit disagreed with "delegation theory"


